JAMES P. LANSIL: - Born in Bangor, Maine, September 30, 1816. Age 84-8

First went to sea, coasting, 1830, and followed it nearly all the time up to 1877, fully forty five years sea service.

In 1877 while in command of the Schooner "Ada Gould" from New York bound to Rio Grande do Sul, she was dismasted and water - logged, the crew were on the vessel fourteen days, and for the last nine days without water and little food. The exposure and suffering very seriously affected his health and nerves, so that with his advanced age, being over sixty, he was compelled to abandon the sea.

Since that he has superintended the building, at the Fair Grounds Bangor, but for the last ten years has been able to do but little and is now entirely disabled.

He presents letters from Henry Lord; J. D. Oaks; Lysander Strickland; John Cassidy and J. W. Palmer, all prominent buisness men of Bangor, certifying to his many years of sea service, and to his good character, commending him to the Trustees.

He has complied with all the Rules and Regulations governing the admission of applicants, and being aged and decrepit, I send him to the Harbor for examination.
